

Swachh Uttarakhand- You Are the Solution Summit Inspired by GIWA Summit in Bihar with HE Governor Ram Nath Kovind

wachh Uttarakhand- You Are the Solution Summit Inspired by GIWA Summit in Bihar came some months before the event, during GIWA's grand Sarva Dharma Swachhta Evam Sadbhavana Sankalp Summit in Bihar, which was held with the technical support of UNICEF.

During the summit, His Excellency, Governor Ram Nath Kovind of Bihar and over twenty prominent interfaith leaders of India's major faiths joined hands with other distinguished dignitaries to pledge for a Swachh Bharat and a Swachh Bihar. Together, they fostered inspiration towards taking actions to ensure safe,

sustainable and healthy water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) for all.

At the event, plans were also announced for the new GIWA Bihar State Chapter. The Chapter will add to the ongoing efforts in the state, and support acceleration of progress in achieving its WASH goals through programmes such as GIWA's World Toilet College and other outreach and capacity development initiatives.

Said HE Governor Ram Nath Kovind, "It is a blessing to be here for the Sarva Dharma Swachhta Evam Sadbhavana Sankalp. I strongly believe that interfaith harmony is the essence of Indian spiritual-cultural heritage, and it is wonderful to see the faith traditions organized here, under the leadership of GIWA Founder, Pujya Swami Chidanand Saraswatiji, for the vital task of providing clean water, sanitation and hygiene for all."

Said HH Pujya Swami Chidanand Saraswatiji, Founder/Chair, Global Interfaith WASH Alliance India and President, Parmarth Niketan, Rishikesh: "Soon we will bring this concept that swachhta starts with oneself. Hence, the solution to the pollution starts with us and in our communities and states, because we are the solution."

HH Pujya Swami Chidanand Saraswatiji: the Journey from Temples to Toilets, From Meditation to Sanitation

ecades ago, as the sun rose beautifully over the Himalayas, HH Pujya Swami Chidanand Saraswatiji was enjoying a morning walk on the banks of Mother Ganga. As He gazed at Mother Ganga's waters, He noticed several pilgrims heeding the call of nature on Her holy banks instead of using toilets. The experience struck Pujya Swamiji deeply. The same river He and tens of millions of other people worshipped as a Divine Goddess was being defiled and polluted.

He pledged from that moment forth to change the situation. He started the construction of toilets inside each of the rooms at Parmarth Niketan. He ensured that the entire ashram was fully-equipped with toilets while He simultaneously oversaw the construction of the beautiful Parmarth Ghat, to be a place where people could come and worship, perform Ganga Aarti, hold numerous, large-scale summits, workshops and meditate. He was certain that people would not defile the same space in which they worship.

Pujya Swamiji also envisioned that the barrier and boundaries faced by sanitation workers must be broken. No longer should casteism be an excuse that prevents us from treating all human beings as part of the same divine and sacred creation.

Through the Global Interfaith WASH Alliance, which He co-founded, the World Toilet College opened its doors in India in 2016 and offers a diverse array of classes. Some of its many courses include: Sanitation Ambassador Training, Public Sanitation Policy, and Toilet Building 101. The World Toilet College trains sanitation workers and others who are aspiring for healthy new livelihoods with the upgraded vocational skills and tools needed to live dignified lives and make their vital contributions for a Swachh Bharat. It also affords them the possibility to make healthy incomes.

Launch of Ganga Gram by Hon'ble Union Cabinet Minister of Drinking Water and Sanitation, Pujya Swamiji & other Dignitaries

GIWA's Interventions Help Virpur Village Officially Become OD-Free



Pujya Swamiji welcomed the Hon'ble Union Cabinet Minister of Drinking Water and Sanitation, Shri Narendra Singh Tomarji to the Virpur Khurd village, a village where our Ganga Action Parivar (GAP), Global Interfaith WASH Alliance (GIWA), Parmarth Niketan and Divine Shakti Foundation (DSF) have been working for many years for sustainable rural development. During the ceremony with the Hon'ble Minister, the village was declared Open Defecation

Free (ODF) and plans were made to work together with the local community to make the village a Ganga Gram, with effective solid and liquid waste management as well as other provisions such as rainwater harvesting, eco-crematoriums, green plantations and so much more.

At the village, Global Interfaith WASH Alliance's interfaith delegation consisting of Chief Jathedar of the Golden Temple Giani Gurbachan Singh, Mufti Nasihur Rahman,







Venerable Lama Lobzang, Venerable Bhikkhu Sanghasena, and Kuldeep Singh Bhogal joined Pujya Swamiji and the Hon'ble Minister in planting the first of 65 trees in honour of Pujya Swamiji's 65th birthday. They also fed cows who are being taken care of by Parmarth Niketan (Rishikesh). Under Pujya Swamiji's leadership Parmarth brings these cows off the street into the cow shelter to graze freely and have healthy feed without ingesting tons of plastic strewn on the streets.

The leaders also inaugurated one of the many toilets that GIWA and GAP have helped make to ensure the village has safe and adequate sanitation. Many of the toilets made in the village were constructed by women, who are part of GIWA's innovative "Women for WASH" initiative, trained at GIWA's World Toilet College to be the torch bearers of a women-led development towards a Swachh Bharat (Clean India). Although there are many household

and community toilets constructed by GIWA, the particular one that was inaugurated is located inside the village's popular temple, symbolising the need for temples and places of worship to build and maintain safe and sufficient facilities for sanitation and hygiene. The inauguration also symbolised the confluence of Pujya Swamiji's vision to bring meditation together with sanitation and GIWA's efforts to bring the faiths together for improved WASH.

Knowledge Sharing and Experience Learning Through Interactive Sessions Brings Leaders from Uttarakhand together with Swachh Bharat Leaders from All Across the Nation!

first of its kind Swachh Uttarakhand, Swachh Bharat **∠** Summit was held by the Global Interfaith WASH Alliance (GIWA), in association with the Ministry of Drinking Water & Sanitation and other partners. The Swachh Uttarakhand Summit brought together organizations, municipalities, panchayat representatives, community and faith leaders who have excelled in sanitation work and demonstrated as a model for others to interface with government officials and elected representatives of Uttarakhand, community leaders, faith leaders and NGOs towards the vision of Uttarakhand as India's first fully-Swachh state.

Recently, Uttarakhand was reported to

have 100% coverage in sanitation and will be the 4th open defecation free (ODF) state in the country. The Summit was a cross learning experience to help sustain Uttarakhand's ODF status as well as to help ensure toilet usage and community ownership of the toilets that have been built. Moreover, the issues related to proper disposal mechanisms for waste, as well as the threat of water scarcity were discussed.

Participants in these deliberations included about 80 gram pradhans and representatives from nagar palika parishads as well as about 60 representatives from the Urban Development Directorate, Swajal Project, Jal Sansthan, SBM urban districts representing: Haridwar, Dehradun, Tehri,

Pauri, Uttarkashi, Rudraprayag, Chamoli and other districts.

The Ministry of Drinking Water & Sanitation, Government of India and Government of Uttarakhand Swachh Bharat and Namami Gange! programme helped GIWA reach out to these key leaders.

Findings of the Summit were presented by Shri Vinod Mishra, Country National Coordinator, India, WSSCC, on behalf of GIWA and all of the participants in the evening before dignitaries including the Union Cabinet Minister of Drinking Water and Sanitation, Shri Narendra Singh Tomar, at the closing ceremonies of the Swachh Uttarakhand Summit.









What the Participants Said

- "Community-led solutions are crucial."
- o Participants said a people's-led movement should be propelled forward for a sustainable Swachhta Kranti (Clean Revolution).
- o Emphasis should be placed on outreach and motivation to ensure that toilets are always used by all.
- "Plans are needed to ensure the proper disposal system of human waste, so it doesn't go into the Ganga and other drinking water sources."
- "For sustainable ODF, 100% of water supply is required for all districts of Uttrakhand including urban and rural areas."
- "Toilets are Needed for Tourists/Floating Populations."
- o Uttarakhand, being a major tourist and pilgrimage destination, receives a sizable floating population around the year. Now is time to ensure that all have access to clean and healthy sanitation.

Leaders from Across India Converge towards Saving India's Water and Ensuring a Swachh Bharat



Said respected Buddhist Leader, Venerable Lama Lobzangji, "In Buddhist temples & monasteries, cleanliness is the first thing to be done in the morning. With that attitude to cleanliness, it is natural that we give great importance on Ma Ganga and its clean water to bring life line to everyone."



Said Father Paul V. Moonjely, Asst. Executive Director, Caritas International, "We have started a worldwide initiative called "carbon fasting". So Catholics across the world, fast to highlight and thank God for giving all the resources and to keep these resources protected. It is also believed in my faith that everyone and everything is created by the Divine in this nature, hence its sanctity and dignity must be maintained."



Said Jathedar of Patna, Giani Iqbal Singhji, "Everyone knows that water is life but it's beautiful to be connected to this movement that Pujya Swamiji has started to protect and preserve the sacred water bodies. I strongly believe that we are connected by this common religion of doing good for everyone."

beautiful and pure, that is how the Divine made her, but it's become ugly and polluted due to us. Hence, it is only each one of us who must now work to return her back to the condition that the Divine created her. I laud Pujya Swamiji and wish him a long and healthy life so that he may continue to serve towards this cause."



Said Mufti Nasihur Rahmanji, "A few weeks ago I was at a village function which ended up going late. I stayed the night and realised next morning that everyone had to go outside in the open to defecate. This idea repulsed me, so I decided to make a toilet for myself. I got a shovel & with help from a local mason made a make-shift toilet. When I visited the village months later, I was glad to see that the village had actually constructed toilets in almost 80% of the households & was on its way to becoming ODF. This is the way that change starts - with each one of us."



Said Kiranjot Kaurji, "The River Ganga flows for everyone. Even the Sikh faith has a very special place for the River Ganga. Because many years ago Guru Nanakji came to Haridwar and was here on the banks of Mother Ganga. Even Guru Gobind Singhji was born in Patna, along the banks of Mother Ganga. Hence, the River Ganga holds a special place in my heart. But water, faith and purification is something that is common amongst all religions."









More of the special Ganga Awards were presented to Mufti Nasihur Rahmanji, Shri Sankar Kumar Sanyalji, President of Harijan Seva Sangh, Shri Anil Kakkarji of Rotary for spreading the message of Swachhta and WASH amongst their communities and congregations.

The event concluded with a divine Ganga Aarti ceremony in which a special premier of the GIWA film, highlighting all of the inspiring work GIWA has been committed to doing was shown. Special video messages by Maulana Wahiduddin Khan, Founder-President, Centre for Peace and Spirituality International, and Bhaisahib Mohinder Singhji, Nishkam Seva Jatha were played and an incredible film on the urgent and vital need to protect Mother Ganga was shown as thousands of pilgrims watched with rapt attention. As Pujya Swami Chidanand Saraswatiji explains:



Waging Sanitation Revolution, Village Women Turn Entrepreneurs In Uttarakhand







Tith bricks and masonry tools in their hands, 25 women from Haridwar in Uttarakhand are waging a silent sanitation revolution in their villages. They are building and selling toilets and ensuring women in their village get access to toilets and clean water.

In Haridwar's Mithi Beri gram panchayat, daily wagers Rajeshwari Devi and Beena Devi, who toil in agricultural fields all day, have now turned into small-time entrepreneurs. The game changer in their lives was a sanitation initiative 'Women For WASH' (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene for All) that taught them to build toilets.

"We do not have toilet at home and face many issues. When they approached us for a project, we immediately said yes," said Beena, adding that people opposed their decision to step out of the house. "We belong to a conservative society," she said. Rajeshwari said that the hurdles they faced did not demoralize them and with the training received at the World Toilet College at Parmarth Niketan, they are now looking forward to build toilets in nearby villages too.

"Now we can build twin pit pour flush toilets on our own. We have just built toilets in Veerpur village in Rishikesh which has been commissioned as Ganga gram now," Rajeshwari was quoted as saying by news agency Press Trust of India.

Two villages on the bank of river Ganga — Veerpur Khurd in Dehradun and Mala in Pauri Garhwal — were adopted by the Union Drinking Water and Sanitation Ministry to turn them into Ganga villages, in collaboration with Global Interfaith WASH Alliance (GIWA).

"They can work only during the non-agriculture season and some villages are in remote areas where it is difficult to reach during monsoon. These are some hurdles but the women are determined to overcome these and be self-employed," said Samuel Herbert, the field officer associated with the project.

The women will now learn about bio digester toilets. They will also have their own brochures soon for getting employment in other villages or states.

Chidanand Saraswati, co-founder and co-chairman of Global Interfaith WASH Alliance said that these women are a role model for others. They will now learn to build bio-digester toilets which are a simple, low-cost technology for treating human waste and can aid in putting an end to open defecation and manual scavenging in the country.
